In addition, permission forms and release of liability documents must be signed by all participants before leaving Sudbury.

While our company has an exemplary safety record, a rafting or kayaking trip on a natural flowing river can present some hazards. You must remember, a river trip on the Kennebec, Dead, Penobscot, Housatonic and West Rivers is not the same as Disneyland.

Because our trips take place in these outdoor settings, there are things that occur which are beyond our control. Examples of these are water flow, river conditions and weather.

People love to experience the thrill and adventure of the outdoors; however, they need to be aware of the hazards. Our liability insurance carriers require participants to sign a liability release. Children under eighteen(18) do not have to sign, and parents should note that, when they sign, they are not signing away their children's rights, but acknowledging the fact that a river trip does have some elements of risk.

The courts have never allowed, and should never allow, an outfitter to hide behind a waiver where gross negligence is involved. Unfortunately, our society seems to have gone mad about suing and the liability waiver at least protects us when we run our business in a prudent manner.

Remember, children under 18 are not required to sign. Parents are signing acknowledging they are aware of the type of activity in which their children are participating. We look forward to your visit and seeing you on the river. If you have any questions, please call our office.
